

The Classics Revisited: Adam and Eve

OVERVIEW

- The most important part about the Adam and Eve story is that God created people in His image.
- God created us so that we would come to know Him and love Him.

LESSON GOAL:

Students will end the discussion understanding that God made us because He loves us and wants us to love Him back.

RELATE

Have everyone answer to get energy and conversation going.

1. What is your favorite fruit?
2. Do you think you know the story of Adam and Eve? Summarize it as a group.
3. Was there a time in your life where you knew something was wrong but did it anyways?

READ

Allow students to bring out different truths found in the Bible passage.

Read Genesis 2:4-25

1. What was the rule God gave Adam?
2. Later in Genesis, Adam and Eve break God's rule. Why do you think it was hard for them to do what God asked them to do instead of doing what they thought was best?

THINK

Allow students to bring out different truths found in the world around them.

1. Why didn't God want Adam and Eve to eat the fruit from that tree? Why did God put the tree in the garden?
2. Why did Adam and Eve take matters into their own hands instead of trusting God's plan?
3. Did God hate Adam and Eve when they disobeyed Him?
4. Why do you think God always will forgive us, no matter what we do?

LIVE

Help your students see for themselves what this Biblical truth looks like in their life.

1. This week your challenge is, if you're going through something difficult in your life, then let God take care of it instead of taking it into your own hands. If you aren't struggling with anything right now, then your challenge is to thank God for the blessings in your life.
